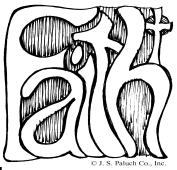
Marriage:

Isaiah tells us something that we already know, and yet seem to forget every now and then. He tells us, essentially, that God is God and we are not.

When we're confused and troubled and can't figure everything out, it might be wise to recall Isaiah speaking on the Lord's behalf and explaining that God--who is on a much more, well, Godly wavelength than we are--moves in ways we can't even imagine.

Saint Paul, by comparison, has everything figured out. Kind of. At least he understands his calling in life--to magnify Christ in everything he does. That should give all of us the direction we need. It is a day for us to recognize and act upon our Catholic teachings, as is every

day when we exercise our political rights and responsibilities. We all have an awareness of the 'big' issues of abortion and the death penalty; we may have a general idea but not a full understanding of the church's stand on stem cell research and immigration reform. As Catholics and Americans we need to be as informed as we can and express the principals of the qualities of life we want our laws to uphold. By accessing www.cacatholic.org, you can read up on any of these issues, some of which you may not have known were in the process of becoming laws. From there you can follow the link to the **Catholic Legislative Network** where you can voice your opinions to your lawmakers. Currently the bishops are asking us to help defeat a bill (AB 499) which undermines parental rights by allowing minor children to receive a controversial vaccine without their parents' knowledge or consent. We want our lawmakers to know that we support policies and services that assist pregnant women to make life-affirming choices. We support stem cell research that does not destroy or clone human embryos. We support patient-focused, quality end-of-life care and oppose legalizing assisted suicide. Make sure your voice is heard.
